Delivery Day Volunteer

Guided by our trainers, volunteers bring their knowledge and experience to support learners to complete predesigned activities on a range of topics such as wants vs needs, payslips and tax, creating a personal budget, savings accounts etc.

Volunteering takes place in a variety of settings, from schools to colleges to community spaces and with ages ranging from 4 to 40.

Tasks may include:

- Introducing yourself and career path to learners
- Helping learners complete predesigned activities
- Where appropriate, sharing your story, experience, and knowledge to give real world examples
- Facilitating discussion by encouraging learners to give answers and share ideas
- Supporting our trainer during the session e.g. setting out resources, sticking work on display boards, reading out instructions etc.

Our trainers are experts in engaging learners, and your role does not include delivering core training.

Your role is to use your passion for financial education to help learners build knowledge and confidence. Taking the initiative to explain terminology or using stories as examples, you will bring finances into the real world. Enabling learners to grasp what it means for them and how they can use Money Ready activities in their daily lives.
